Every year, your donations put new books, audiobooks, and movies on the shelves, buy subscriptions for online books, magazines, and movies, and pay for mundane but essential items like protection software on computers and the plastic for covering books to extend their shelf life.

Because of your generosity, this year we were able to replace our six aging public computers, used by patrons who don't have personal computers or printers. Whenever you come to the library, you'll see the computers in use as patrons check their email, pay bills, research topics, and print out everything from forms tax to directions to the dentist.

All day, a steady stream of people come into the library as residents from Patagonia and the nearby areas read and check out books and magazines, use the computers, hold meetings, ask questions, browse, and socialize with neighbors and friends. Tourists make the library a stop during their stay in Patagonia. The Patagonia Library definitely plays an essential role in our community. Thank you for helping create this vibrant space.



Library Director's Corner

In the spring of 2023, the library received a grant from the Arizona State Library for \$10,000 to renovate the children's computer room. These funds will create a comfortable, welcoming learning environment. Six new computers will be purchased to replace the outdated ones. Additionally, the grant will fund an after school tutoring program for students who are struggling in school or need individualized help.

Our second success was the children's summer programing. The kids read 142 books altogether, which is comparable to our pre-COVID numbers. The children's program, Mad Scientists, had the highest participation, with 5-6 kids attending every week. Our young writers wrote two complete novels, which will be added to the library's collection as physical books. Dungeons and Dragons has been so popular that it will continue throughout the year and will be available to kids and adults alike. We typically have 15-20 participants each week.






Library Funding

Each year, it takes \$150,000 to keep our library going. The Town of Patagonia provides two-thirds of the funding. The town money and some funds from Santa Cruz County pay for staff salaries, utilities, and building upkeep. The Friends of the Library pays for the
